1. [12 points] The two continuous functions $g(x)$ and $h(x)$ have the following properties.

- $\int_{-2}^{4} g(t) d t=11$
- $H(5)-H(1)=-3$, where $H(x)$ is an antiderivative of $h(x)$
- $\int_{-1}^{2} g(t) d t=5$
- $\int_{-2}^{2} h(x) d x=6$.
- $\int_{-0.5}^{1} g(t) d t=3$
- $\int_{5}^{14} h(x) d x=15$
- $g(x)=7$ on the interval $[4,6]$
- $\int_{-\infty}^{2} h(x) d x=20$.

Calculate the following values. Write "DIVERGES" if appropriate.
If there is not enough information provided to find the exact value, write "not enough info." You are not required to show your work on this problem. However, limited partial credit may be awarded based on work shown.
a. [3 points] $\int_{-2}^{6} g(x) d x$
